A study of more than 192,000 Americans found that consuming five servings of dark chocolate per week (not per day) lowers the risk of developing type-2 diabetes by 21%. No benefits of consuming milk chocolate were found.

Bananas contain over 400 mg. of potassium and just one mg. of sodium, which helps lower blood pressure and maintain a fluid balance in blood and tissue cells. Membership SPECIAL

MRSPA is again offering the \$10 (prorated) state dues special for new and former members between March 1 and May 31, 2025, for the current 2024-2025 membership and fiscal year. Local dues rates remain the same. This change is to encourage **new** and **former** members to sign up for dues deduction during this March to May period and therefore pay NO state dues with the \$10 state dues reduction incentive (dues deduction members only). Local dues will be collected.

New or former members who sign up during this time, who elect to pay by credit card or check, will still owe the \$10 state dues and local dues. Checks are still payable to MRSPA for the state and local dues amount. Locals will receive their dues from MRSPA as per the usual procedure. These new and reinstated members will be billed for their 2025-2026 dues at the full rate in July.
