CONSUMER UPDATE

Where do you Keep your Medications?

It seems convenient to keep your medications in the bathroom, but bathrooms can become hot and humid. Dampness accelerates deterioration of dry medicines (such as tablets), while heat hastens the breakdown of liquids and creams. Unless a medicine says specifically to refrigerate, don't do it because liquid medications can separate and solid crystals will form and sink to the bottom of the bottle. This would cause one to not get the intended dose.

So, what do you do with your medications? They are best kept in cool, dry places, preferably in a drawer. If there are grandchildren visiting, be sure that your medications are not where there could find them.

Car Dangers

Cars require 100% attention even when they are not on the road.

Tips to avoid being hurt or hurting someone else:

- 1. To avoid rolling-vehicle danger, you should always put the car in park when you stop if you have automatic transmission. With manual transmission the car should be left in gear. Parking brakes should be checked regularly.
- 2. At the service station, static electricity can ignite gasoline and start fires. Don't get back in your car while you are refueling. Sliding across the fabric or leather seat can create static electricity. After refueling leave the nozzle in place for a few seconds which will eliminate

drips.

- 3. Carbon-monoxide (CO) is deadly. Never warm-up or leave your car running in a closed garage.
- 4. Trunk-entrapment. Cars manufactured since 2001 have emergency trunk releases. If you have an older car, be sure that the car is locked at all times, thus children cannot get in the trunk.

While you may say, "I've heard these things before," knowing them is not the same as following them.

Coffee's Many Uses

It can neutralize odors. Ground coffee absorbs moisture and replaces an offending odor with the smell of coffee. Hang a cheesecloth pouch filled with cooled used coffee grounds in the cabinet where the garbage is kept.

It can be a stress buster. Inhaling the scent of roasted coffee beans eases stress and produces a natural relaxation.

It can be a skin exfoliate. Mix one cup of ground coffee, one-half cup sugar and one-half tablespoon of jojoba oil. Apply the mixture to your body, rub gently in a circular motion, rinse, and pat dry.

If you Lose your Laptop

Confidential files, email, bank account numbers, passwords, etc. may fall into the hands of wrongdoers. To be safe –

regularly back up the files on your laptop а desktop to computer, portable disk drive, or online data-storage service and encrypt the files on your computer so no wrongdoer who obtains it can access them. Many commercial encryption software products are available. To find the latest reviews of new products, go to Google.com and enter "encryption software reviews" to search.

Starting this month (August 2010) there are new rules for gift cards. You will have one year to spend a gift card before any fees can be charged and they won't expire before five years.

For the November 2 General Election the early voting centers will be open starting Friday, October 22 through Thursday, October 28 except for Sunday, October 24 at the same locations and time.

You receive it sooner. It does not have to be labeled, stamped and depend on the post office to deliver

It saves paper. Are you aware that we print 2200 copies of the Informer 5 times a year for a total of 55,000 sheets of paper?

How can this be accomplished?

The membership committee must have your email address. (Are you aware that you can create an email address for free at sites such

as Hot Mail?)

You can send your email address to the committee along with your name and phone number to AARSPAInformer@yahoo.com . And, if you make changes it can be done the same way.

How is my information protected?


