# **Treasurer's Report**

Our membership is less than projected which will impact the budget. There is a carryover from the last budget for our scholarship committee, \$23,766.32 balance. Scholarship funds will continue to be collected through June, and additional amounts from membership dues April-June will increase the amount available for scholarships in 2026. The Free School budget continues to be good. The Gunson Fund has been converted to CDs earning 4%. The FY2026 proposed budget was presented to the membership.

The state has \$3 billion dollars deficit. She stated that 1/10 federal employees live in Maryland. The school Blue Print is very important to the state and they will support funding for it. There is a shortage of teachers and there are 1,000-5,000 vacancies. The healthcare benefit we have is not negotiable, so pay close attention to the developments. What can we do? Ms. Crespo provided a list of senators and representatives for Maryland. She stated that contact by phone, email, and even visits will allow the representatives and senators to know how their constituents see the current issues. See attached document.
